### DAILY READINGS

We take a break from reading Matthew this week since we have visiting preachers. However, the daily readings continue as follows:

**Monday:** Deut 18:14-19 - God promises a prophet like Moses - which is ultimately fulfilled in Jesus' teachings

**Tuesday:** Ezekiel 34:1-31 - God himself will come as Shepherd and Judge - cf. John 10; Matt 7

**Wednesday:** Isaiah 55:1-13 - Invitation to the thirsty and God's fulfilment of his everlasting covenant with David - cf. John 8:37ff

**Thursday:** Isaiah 61:1-3 - God's anointed servant - cf. Luke 4:14-21.

**Friday:** Psalm 22 - Compare with the description of Jesus' suffering on the cross

**Saturday:** Heb 8:1-13 - Fulfilment of the promised new covenant in Jesus' blood

**Sunday:** Isaiah 49:1-13 - The servant will save people from all nations.
